Piedmont Classical High School, by providing a rigorous, traditional education, will graduate productive citizens prepared to succeed in any endeavor.

Piedmont Classical High School (PCHS) is a public charter school founded in 2015, currently serving grades 9-12. Piedmont Classical High School is located in Greensboro, NC, a city of about 230,000, but Piedmont Classical enrolls students from Guilford, Rockingham, Randolph, Forsyth, and Davidson counties. Piedmont Classical students are both racially and economically diverse. As a charter school, Piedmont Classical High School is accountable to and accredited by North Carolina State Department of Instruction. The class of 2018 will be PCHS's first graduating class.

Course Offerings: Students can enroll in courses at the Standard, Honors, and AP Level. Teachers recommend students for the course level, but ultimately the families can waive the recommendation and enroll their student in upper-level courses. In the 2016-2017 academic year, PCHS offered seven face-to-face AP Courses, with 53 students enrolled. Students can elect to supplement their studies by enrolling in North Carolina Virtual Public Schools (NCVPS) courses through PCHS; a total of 11 students enrolled in AP courses through NCVPS in order to take an AP Course not offered face-to-face at PCHS. Students who are eligible can also dually enroll with Guilford Technical Community College. Electives can include additional core subject courses, any of the fine arts, Advanced PE, Yearbook, or Journalism.

Classical Model: Students are required to take at least one year of Latin as a part of our classical model. Sophomores are required to take a logic course, and all seniors take a rhetoric course that incorporates a senior graduation project.

Course Credit: Piedmont Classical High School operates on a modified block schedule. Students take seven courses four days a week (three days for 52 minutes, one day for 92 minutes) for the entire school year. Report cards are distributed at midterm and end of the year, with progress reports in between.
